A Sticky Wicket—as they say

I have been in the education profession since the 1990's as a paraprofessional first and then in 2002, I transitioned to a teacher position. Education has changed significantly since those days and even more since I attended grades K-12 as a student. Back in my student days, the schools in Kansas, for the most part, followed the same norms. These norms were: a 5 day school week, a 6.5 hour school day, a minimum of 185 student contact days, students were held accountable for completing assignments, maintaining passing grades, memorization of facts, and exhibiting acceptable behaviors at school. And in my day, if you were in trouble at school, it was worse trouble at home.

We have decreased the number of student contact days, we have changed classroom requirements and the perspective has shifted from what did the student do to what did the school do to cause this to happen. We need to get back to the mission of EDUCATION! Our mission at Fowler is to build relationships that facilitate accountability, responsibility, respect, and enhance academic and social growth for lifelong success. My personal mission is "doing what is best for every student, every day in every way". I want to take Fowler Grade School back to the basics and do what is best for our students. I have worked in districts with a 4 day school week and a 5 day school week. As a staff member I love the 4 day work week, but is it what is best for our students? According to KSDE, in "rural/districts, four-day weeks **do not appear to improve academic outcomes** and may be associated with **lower performance on standardized tests, particularly ACT** than five-day schools". In order to do what is best for kids, I believe that Fowler should return to a 5 day school week with a shorter school day. Some will disagree with me, but Fowler test scores have basically been stagnate for the last few years. We need to move the needle and in order to do that, we must make changes. As you know, a popular definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over and expecting a different result. Another change needed is the reduction of electronic device usage during the school day. Research shows that paper / pencil learning is more beneficial than device usage. That is not to say that devices are not beneficial when used appropriately. We need to get back to the basics and teach our students how to think independently, how to properly use technology as a tool to aid them, and how to make the best choice possible for the situation at the time.
